Writing a Preached Reflection

The Lombardi method:

Step One: Keep a journal of key moments in your faith journey:

- Conversations
- Relationships
- Your emotional response to situations
- Your prayer life after the encounters

Step Two: Choose an encounter that stirred up the most emotion in you:

- Fear
- Joy
- Awe
- Peace
- Confusion

Step Three: Choose a passage from scripture that relates to the encounter:

For example, fear (Matthew 8: 23-27)



Step Four: Consult a biblical commentary and note any new insights related to the biblical text and/or church document

For example, John Paul II's Apostolic Letter, *Salvifici Doloris*, especially the last section on the Good Samaritan (good for anything on suffering)

Step Five: Summarize your encounter with one point/message

For example, trust in the Lord is the only remedy for fear

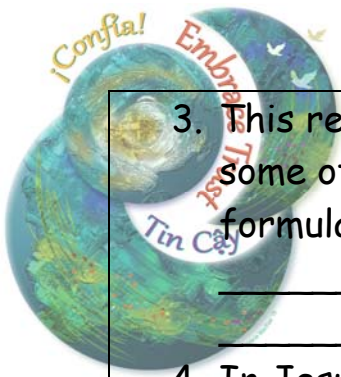
Step Six: Relate your encounter to today's context (Sociological data)

- Youth related issues
- Relationships/Family Life, etc.

Step seven: End with a recommendation

Step eight: Preach your theological reflection using the following model:

1. Read passage from scripture
