





Celebrating 40 Years of the Religious Education Congress

Though this year marks our 40th Congress, the event really had its roots earlier. In 1956, the first Los Angeles CCD "Institute" was held at Mount Carmel High School on Hoover Street in Los Angeles. Some 500 teachers and catechists attended the two-day conference, listened to speakers and gained experience from other teachers. The institutes grew in attendance each year and by 1967 it was apparent that local schools could no longer handle the crowds and a new site was needed.

So it was in 1967 with the cooperation of the three dioceses of Los Angeles, Monterey-Fresno and San Diego, the agenda for the first three-day "Congress" was set. The purpose, as stated by officials: "The Southern California Confraternity Congress hopes to provide an atmosphere of Christian unity ... and learning, where all who attend may advance scholastically and spiritually for the benefit of each and the common good of all."

Held January 13-15, 1967, at the International Hotel near Los Angeles International Airport, the first Southern California Confraternity Congress had a registration fee of \$5. The theme was adopted from the words of Pope John XXIII in his opening address to the Second Vatican Council:

"The greatest concern of the Ecumenical Council is this: that the sacred deposit of Christian doctrine should be guarded and taught more efficaciously."

"From these words the decrees of Vatican II have formulated for Christians everywhere certain duties: to learn; to live and to share more fully the message of salvation," the pre-event materials stated.

At the second CCD Congress February 2-4, 1968 (also at the International Hotel), registration remained \$5, with self-parking 50 cents, \$1 for valet.

The theme: "The unmistakable work being done today by the Holy Spirit in making the laity ever more conscious of their own responsibility and encouraging them to serve Christ and the church in all circumstances."

The third Congress (February 21-23, 1969) was the last at the International Hotel, and was the first to incorporate Scripture in its theme: "How beautiful on the mountains, are the feet of one who brings good news, who heralds peace, brings happiness, proclaims salvation, and tells Zion, 'Your God is king' (Isaiah 52:7)."

Again, attendance began to outgrow the hotel's facilities, and in 1970 Congress moved to the much larger Anaheim Convention Center (February 20-22), where registration was \$5 for one day or per workshop; \$10 for two days. The first day was a Youth Conference for high school students only.

The March 26-28, 1971 Congress carried the theme "You Shall be my Witnesses to the Ends of the Earth" (Acts 1:8), while the February 18-20, 1972, Congress was a 50th Jubilee celebration of the creation of the CCD in Los Angeles.

In 1973, the event was retitled the Religious Education Congress, and bilingual themes were adopted in 1979.

We continue this ancient Church Liturgical tradition in Saturday's Morning Prayer to welcome the gift of a new day, as well as in Friday and Saturday Evening Prayer (sometimes known as Vespers) to celebrate the Light that shines through the night's darkness. In Night Prayer (also known as Compline), we complete the Hours in prayer at the day's end.


