Formation

- Ground everything in terms of a living and personal relationship with God...and one another. Listen to and share personal faith journeys – <u>Forming Intentional Disciples</u>.
- Front-loaded Focus: Baptism Ministry...move from hoop jumping task to conversion. (Get away from "class" language in any adult formation.) The most important evangelizing ministry. Starts with the phone call or email...can be seen extending to Pre/K/1st Grade!
- Expand beyond parish *information* in bulletin and parish website to *outreach and formation* utilizing Facebook/Twitter...and plain old email. (Resource people where they live and learn...digitally.)
- Give emphasis to Catholic spirituality and Scripture...what people want (...as well liturgy and sacraments...what they need).
- Shift sacrament prep for parents (and all parent formation)
 ...from logistics and catechesis...to fostering of conversion
 (aka. evangelization). Parents or bust! Family formation must
 have a strong parent-specific dimension.
- Lead with language of Catholic "faith" more than "Church". ("Natural Law" better than "the Church says" as entry into thorny moral issues, for example.)

- Sacramental Catch Up vs. RCIA Adapted for Children and Youth
- Embracing the "loose thread" folks...listen, care, accompany. Do not tell them to come back in August! They are Jesus.
- Develop experience-laden ministries with theological reflection built in. (Post-moderns want *experience*.) Form people to become reflective...with a Catholic consciousness/worldview.
- Don't teach *to* the sacrament. Teach *through* the sacrament (i.e. Confirmation and discipleship lifestyle...and Eucharist). Form for the long-run, for something to grow *into*...not *out* of.
- Praying well with children, youth and adults. Lectionary-based liturgical prayer...to form a Catholic liturgical sensibility.
- Culturally-sensitive *and* prophetically faithful: Holding tension in the Catholic message. (i.e. moral issues of the day)
- Build formation for children and youth with intentionality, under the assumption that we're going to *lose* them...not that we are going to keep them. This is reality, not heresy.
- RE Registration Marketing Outreach... connect with and invite *far* beyond the parish data base. Major evangelization opportunity!

Parish

- Who is the parish? Have a Canon Law vision.
- Form/evangelize from the inside out...parish staff and leadership.
- Devotional vs. Missional Church...strike the balance, hold the tension.
- Effective welcoming and intentional orientation process. Fight the *anonymous Catholic* syndrome; "click here to become a member"...seriously?
- Mid-lifers, the Vulnerable and the Wounded...when things break down we open to grace.
- Affect attracts...or repels. Eye contact, facial expression, vocal intonation are essential elements in evangelization...and every aspect of parish. Grace builds upon nature. Vibe matters!
- <u>Trend</u>: *Customization* because "it's all about me"...post-modern intuition. <u>Counter-trend</u>: Invitation to participate in something bigger than yourself...objective truth, community (including the communion of saints), building the Reign of God. Hold tension.
- Sunday liturgy is *huge*. It reflects *and* propels. Liturgy does more to form a parish (for good or for ill) than anything else!
- Wedding, Funerals, Baptisms are opportunities to evangelize! (...guests and one's own.)
- Evangelization is a *ground* game. Person by person, family by family, moment by moment...gaining trust, growing relationships.

Leadership

- Gifts/charisms discernment and empowerment. Expand stakeholders. Build and form teams. (Don't guard responsibilities...give away!) Pay special attention to young adults.
- Assume the best in people's motivations and intentions...not the worst.
- Kindness and graciousness is needed more than ever. People's wells out there are dry...and often poisoned. Help to de-toxify people (if possible) and systems we serve.
- Create openness to seeing connections, possibilities, synergies... potential within a parish. Take the blinders off...within yourself... and invite it from others. Peripheral vision!
- Deep reverence for and docility to the Holy Spirit. Make friends with the Holy Spirit and ask to be an instrument of the Spirit's divine will. (Create a parish culture of calling the Holy Spirit down and see what happens.)
- Don't be a functionary. Be a leader. Be a risk-taker. Vision, not minutia, should define and drive you. Recognize your importance...see the real, symbolic power in your role. Affirm, invite and challenge.
- Psycho-spiritual connection. Process and address your stuff elsewhere...so that you can get out of your issues and insecurities (when in a parish role) and into the other person(s): *empathy*
